Re: Review of Bill 203 - Fair Trading (Motor Vehicle Repair Pricing Protection for Consumers) Amendment Act, 2016

Bill 203 - *Fair Trading (Motor Vehicle Repair Pricing Protection for Consumers) Amendment Act, 2016* was referred by the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, after first reading, for review by the Standing Committee on Families and Communities. Bill 203 recommends changing the way in which auto service and repair businesses operate in the province in order to provide increased protection to consumers. The Bill proposes amendments to the *Fair Trading Act* that would require automotive service and repair businesses to provide written estimates, invoices and warranties, and to return removed or replaced parts.

The Committee is seeking input from stakeholders and would like to invite your participation.
