Dear Committee,

As a long term General Motors Dealer of 38 years, please consider my comments with regard to your decision on this very important Bill. It appears to me that the present legislation that now exists is very sufficient to protect consumers and repair facilities in our Province. As noted MNP report, the study states that MDA member dealers in 2014 performed 5,049,750 repair service orders for Alberta businesses and families. AMVIC statistics for one year in 2015 showed that there were 45 consumer complaints addressed to AMVIC regarding vehicle repairs performed by MDA members for that 12 month period. These 45 complaints equate to 1/10000th of 1%. If the Member Mr. Carson done his homework he would have noted that we are well regulated in the Province of Alberta and no further burden need to be place on the Automotive sector of this Province. The harshness of this Bill 203 is totally unacceptable and I respectfully request this Bill 203 be withdrawn. If there is to be further discussion on this Bill 203 I respectfully request that representatives from Motor Dealers Association of Alberta be consulted and involved.
