II. INTRODUCTION

The Standing Committee on Public Accounts comprises a Chair, who is a Member of the Official Opposition (New Democratic Party-NDP), and a Deputy Chair, who is a Member of the Government caucus (United Conservative Party-UCP). The composition of the remaining 10 members is approximately proportionate to the number of seats held by the NDP and UCP in the Legislative Assembly of Alberta.

The mandate of the Standing Committee on Public Accounts is to review the public accounts of the province of Alberta and ministry annual reports through the process of asking questions with respect to the expenditures of Government departments and the Auditor General's reports. Pursuant to Standing Order 53(1), the public accounts and all reports of the Auditor General stand permanently referred to the Committee.

The public accounts of Alberta are prepared in accordance with the *Financial Administration Act* and the *Fiscal Management Act*. The public accounts consist of the annual report of the Government of Alberta and the annual reports of each of its ministries.

The 2019-2020 annual report of the Government of Alberta contains accountability statements and the consolidated financial statements of the province. *Measuring Up,* which measures and reports on performance, compares actual performance results with the desired results set out in the Government's business plan.

The annual reports for the ministries for the year ended March 31, 2020, contain ministers' accountability statements, the audited consolidated financial statements of the ministries, and a comparison of actual performance results as well as the desired results set out in the ministries' business plans.

The reports of the Auditor General include annual reports and special reports. Annual reports provide audit findings and include recommendations for the improvement of controls and processes within government and the issuance of audit opinions on the financial statements of ministries, agencies and boards, and commissions. Special reports of the Auditor General are prepared on any matter of importance or urgency that the Auditor General believes should not be deferred until the presentation of the annual report.

III. MANDATE AND SCOPE

The mandate of the Public Accounts Committee includes reviewing and reporting on the public accounts of Alberta, all reports of the Auditor General of Alberta, and other matters which may be referred to the Committee by the Assembly. Its mandate extends to all public entities funded by Government, including agencies and boards and commissions. All reports of the Auditor General stand permanently referred to the Public Accounts Committee.

The Committee calls on senior department officials and/or officials of agencies, boards, and commissions and such others as may be necessary to fulfill its mandate.

The Committee sets its own agendas and may sit whether or not the Assembly is in session. The Committee may report to the Assembly on a particular matter or generally with respect to its body of work, and the Government shall respond to a substantive report of the Public Accounts Committee within 150 days of the date on which the Committee reports.

IV. ACTIVITIES OF THE COMMITTEE

In the winter of 2020, prior to the commencement of the 2020 spring sitting, the Committee met three times. During the 2020 spring sitting of the Second Session of the 30th Legislature the Committee met nine times. The Committee also met on October 2, 2020, when the Assembly was not in session. The Committee held six meetings during the 2020 fall sitting, including one educational session with the Auditor General on November 10, 2020.

The COVID-19 pandemic necessitated changes to committee practices. Legislative Assembly of Alberta standing and special committees have long permitted teleconference participation but, pursuant to the *Legislative Assembly Act*, the Committee allowed videoconference participating at its first meeting following declaration of the pandemic. Alberta's Standing Committee on Public Accounts was one of the first in Canada to hold such hybrid meetings. Pursuant to Section 6 of the *Legislative Assembly Act*, the Committee approved the use of videoconferencing at its April 27, 2020, meeting with the following motion:

MOVED by Mr. Gotfried that for the duration of the Second Session of the 30th Legislature the Standing Committee on Public Accounts permit Members of the Legislative Assembly to participate in Committee meetings via videoconference subject to the proviso that the Committee may require Members' personal attendance at a particular meeting upon passage of a motion to that effect.

An amendment to Standing Order 52(1)(b) on February 26, 2020, saw the Committee's membership reduced from 15 Members to 12.

The Subcommittee on Committee Business met eight times during this reporting period to discuss and recommend schedules for meetings with ministries, including agencies, boards, and commissions reporting to the ministries, and to highlight any potential issues of interest for the Committee.

Committee Research Services and the Office of the Auditor General continued to provide oral and written research briefings for caucus research staff. Committee members also started participating in oral briefings. With the participation of Members in oral research briefings, the Committee discontinued its practice of conducting closed-session pre-meeting briefings for Members immediately prior to the commencement of a scheduled Committee meeting.

The proceedings of the Standing Committee on Public Accounts are open to the public. Audio and video coverage of Committee meetings is streamed live on the Internet, broadcast on Alberta Assembly TV, and recorded by *Alberta Hansard*. The audio- and video-stream, as well as the transcripts of meetings can be accessed via the Legislative Assembly website at www.assembly.ab.ca and through the Legislature Library.
