

Review of the Public Sector Compensation Transparency Act

The Canadian Taxpayers Federation opposes any change to the Public Sector Compensation Transparency Act that would reduce transparency, especially relating to the government's salary and severance disclosure, or the "sunshine list." The Alberta government's sunshine list should continue to display the ministry, name, position, classification, year, salary, cash benefits, non-cash benefits, severance and attachments for eligible government employees. Any changes to the Act should enhance transparency, such as expanding the employees who are reported in the sunshine list.

The Alberta government should have the most transparent sunshine list in the country, and continue to be a model for the province's municipalities, such as Calgary and Edmonton.
