

Warm-up


- Show learners a picture of Alberta's Coat of Arms.
- Introduce/review vocabulary for activities.


Activities

- Play the audio twice. Learners listen.
- Distribute the worksheet and explain the procedures for Activity 1. Play the audio again. Then read the yes/no questions to the class. Learners listen and circle the correct answers on their worksheets. Repeat the questions if necessary.
- Explain the procedures for Activity 2. Play the audio again. Learners listen and label the picture. Replay the audio again if necessary.

Assessment

Instructor corrects individual learner responses for the listening activities.





Listening Activity

Transcript

Anna is on a field trip with her ELL class. They are at the Alberta Legislature Building in Edmonton. They are listening to a Heritage Interpreter. The Heritage Interpreter is talking about two very special doors inside the building.

Heritage Interpreter: These are very special doors. They are the doors to the Chamber. The Chamber is where the government meets.

The doors and the coat of arms are made of wood. They were carved by hand.

Anna: Excuse me. I see three animals on the coat of arms. What are the names of those animals?

Heritage Interpreter: The animal on the left is a lion. The animal on the right is a pronghorn antelope. The animal on the top is a beaver.

Anna's classmate: What's on top of the beaver?

Heritage Interpreter: That's a crown.

Anna: What's between the lion and antelope?

Heritage Interpreter: That's the shield of Alberta. Can you see the Rocky Mountains? Can you see the

wheat?

Anna: Yes, I can.

Comprehension Questions (Read by the instructor)

- 1. Is Anna on a field trip with her family?
- 2. Is Anna listening to a Heritage Interpreter?
- 3. Is the Heritage Interpreter talking about a statue?
- **4.** Are the doors made of wood?
- 5. Are the doors old?

Our Field Trip Instructor's Notes

Learners listen to sentences about their upcoming field trip to the Alberta Legislature and write the details about their field trip.

Warm-up

- Show learners a picture of the Alberta Legislature.
- Ask learners if they have seen or visited this building.

Activity

Make sentences about the upcoming field trip. For example,

- 1. We are going on a field trip. We are going to the Alberta Legislature.
- 2. We are going on (date of the field trip).
- 3. We are going by (method of transportation).
- We are going to leave at (time of departure).
- 5. Please bring (camera, lunch, et cetera).
 - Read the sentences twice. Learners listen.
 - Distribute the worksheet and explain the procedures for the activity.
 - Read the sentences again. Learners listen and write the correct information on their worksheet. Repeat the sentences if necessary.

Instructor corrects individual learner responses for the listening activity.





Facts about Alberta and the Alberta Legislature

Speaking and Listening Activity

An information gap activity introduces some facts about Alberta and the Alberta Legislature.

Warm-up

Introduce/review vocabulary for activity.

Activity

- Pair up the learners. Distribute Worksheet 1 to Student A and Worksheet 2 to Student B. Explain the procedures for the activity.
- Learners ask and answer the questions on their worksheets and write down the correct information on their charts. Learners ask for assistance when necessary.
- Correct together. Discuss the meanings of any unfamiliar words.
