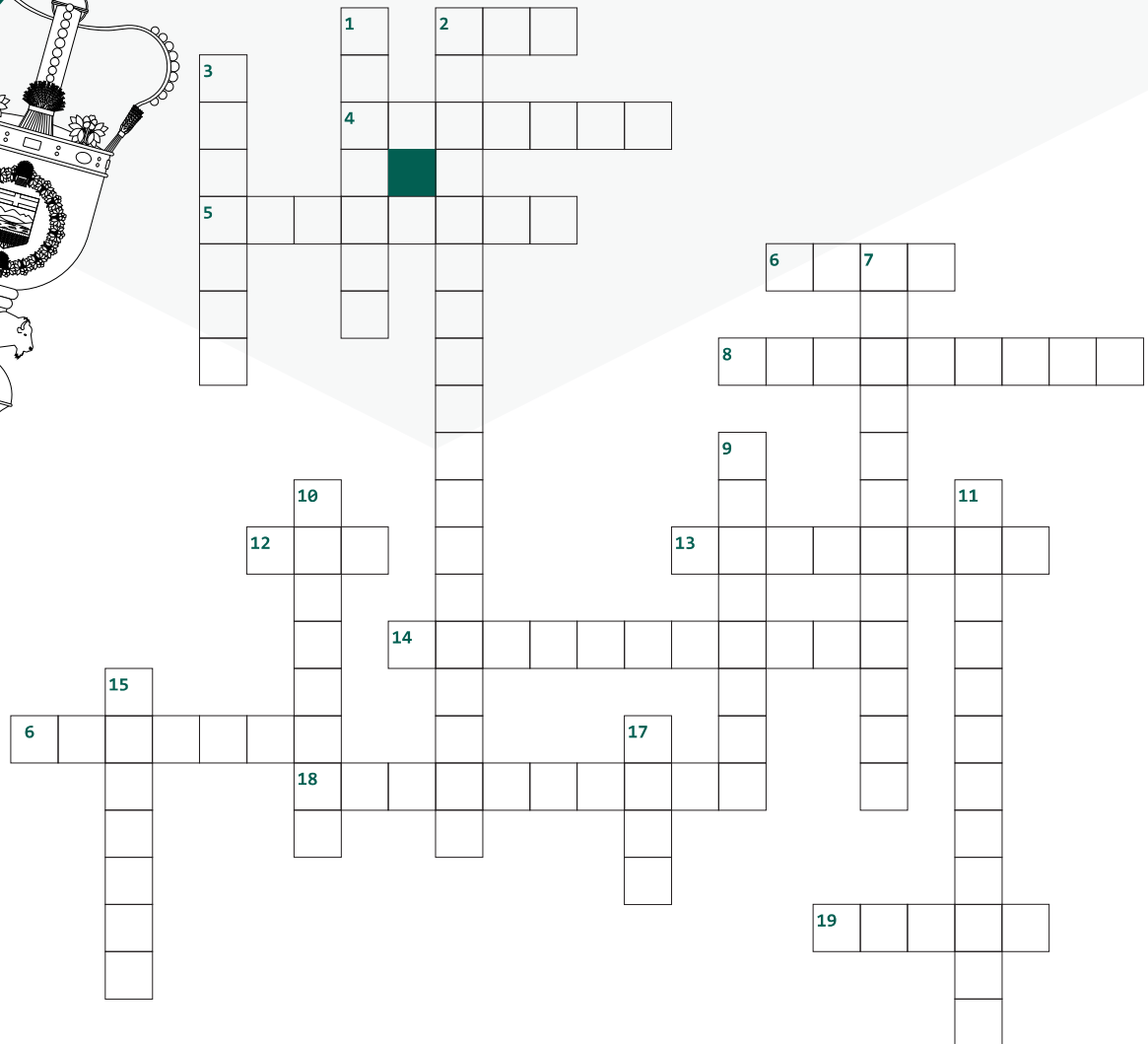
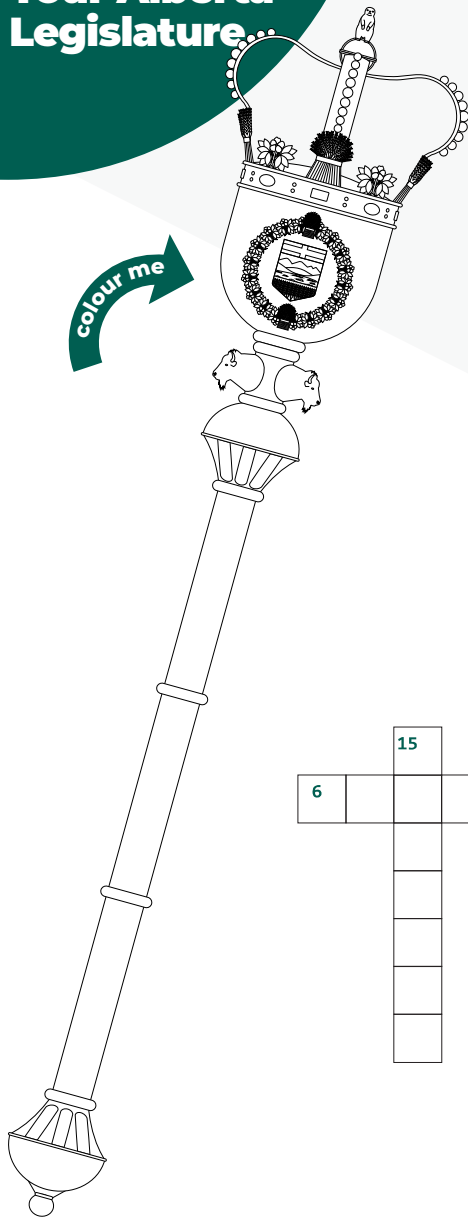


Constitutional Crossword

2. What a bill is called after being granted Royal Assent.
4. The impartial presiding officer of the assembly who maintains order in the Chamber, often referred to as the “referee” of the Assembly.
5. An MLA who is selected by the Premier to head a provincial government department.
6. The ceremonial staff that symbolizes the authority of the Legislature to make laws on behalf of the people. The Legislative Assembly cannot meet unless it is present.
8. A proposed change to a Bill.
12. Shorthand for a Member of the Legislative Assembly. They are elected to represent the people within a constituency.
13. A law-making body of people consisting of the Lieutenant Governor and the Legislative Assembly, also, the name of the building where these people work.
