A mysterious illness swept the globe in 1918; the Spanish Flu, as the pandemic came to be known, was as indiscriminate as it was ruthless. Estimates place the worldwide mortality rate at up to 100 million people. Roughly 1 in 6 Canadians perished. More than 4,000 Albertans died within four months. What happened? And what did it mean for the young province of Alberta?
